Care is given to this process to ensure that the family understands how seriously we take our educational process at NSCS. During HOME VISITS, teacher take with them a sample copy of the curriculum objectives with "I Can Statements " as and introductory information to parents. During this home visit the teachers will share classroom and homework expectations with student and their families.

We conduct and annual MAP RALLY to give certificate of achievements to our students that are proficient and advanced on the assessment and highlight for our students the academic behaviors that will help them to achieve success and how their teachers can help them. After the MAP RALLY, all our MAP tested students

Furthermore, NSCS teachers have designed an individual teacher compact (approved by administration) focusing on building relationship with her/his students and focusing on helping the student grow academically and socially.

Again, NSCS supports all our teachers in expanding their knowledge base through year-long PD in the four key subject areas especially in ELA and MATH. Specifically, the ongoing trainings are in:

- a. ELA (Balanced Literacy, Guided Reading. Writing, Curriculum design, Instructional Strategies and Assessment)
- b. Math, (Balanced Math, Curriculum Design, Instructional Strategies and Assessment
- c. Science) (MySci ). We believe that well trained teachers make all the difference in their classrooms.

NSCS progress monitors and reteaches for mastery every five to six weeks. Finally, NSCS uses a TA model to tutor struggling students in realtime daily. These are the ways NSCS supports and creates effective learning environment for our students.

Parents will respond to whatever is needed in the comment box. Lately teachers have been approved to text, use Class-Dojo, email and call when necessary. Sometimes these communication processes may just be to congratulate a student and their parents for a job well done. We also use ROBO-Calls to contact our parents for important announcements.
